



Proposition 65 (Prop 65) Declaration

The California Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, commonly known as **Proposition 65 (Prop 65)**, requires businesses selling products in California to provide a clear and reasonable warning if their products may expose consumers to chemicals known by the State of California to cause cancer, birth defects, or other reproductive harm.

The list of Proposition 65 chemicals is maintained and periodically updated by the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA). IPP Operations, LLC continually monitors applicable regulatory changes and evaluates its products and manufacturing processes to support compliance with Proposition 65 requirements.

Based on information provided by our suppliers and our knowledge of our manufacturing processes, **IPP Operations, LLC** believes its products are safe when used as intended and disposed of in accordance with applicable federal, state, and local regulations. However, because certain raw materials or components may contain trace amounts of one or more Proposition 65 listed chemicals, and because exposure assessments are product- and use-specific, IPP Operations, LLC has adopted a conservative compliance approach by providing Proposition 65 warnings, where appropriate.

The standard warning used by IPP Operations, LLC is:

⚠ WARNING: This product can expose you to chemicals including lead, which are known to the State of California to cause cancer or birth defects or other reproductive harm.

A Proposition 65 warning does **not** mean that a product is unsafe or that it violates any federal or state product safety standard. Proposition 65 is a consumer "right-to-know" law that requires warnings for specified chemical exposures and does not prohibit the use of listed chemicals in products.

IPP Operations, LLC continually monitors changes to California Proposition 65, including updates to the lists of chemicals maintained by the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) and revisions to the Proposition 65 warning regulations. Our compliance program is reviewed periodically to ensure conformity with current regulatory requirements.
