



Toxic Substance Control Act (TSCA) Declaration

The Toxic Substance Control Act of 1976 (TSCA) is a federal regulation that allows the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to comprehensively manage chemicals in U.S. commerce. Under TSCA Section 6(h) Restriction on Persistent, Bio accumulative and Toxic (PBT) Substances, final rules were published in January 2021 restricting five chemicals, including treated articles containing the chemicals, from distribution in U.S. commerce:

- PIP 3:1 (CAS 68937-41-7)
- DecaBDE (CAS 1163-19-5)
- 2,4,6 TTBP (CAS 732-26-3)
- HCBd (CAS 87-68-3)
- PCTP (CAS 133-49-3)
